



The Choluteca Bridge in Honduras was completed in 1998 by a Japanese firm. On October 8, of that year, Hurricane Mitch, a Category 5 hurricane struck Honduras killing 7,000. Mitch struck with such ferocity that it permanently moved the river away from the Choluteca Bridge rendering it unusable. *USA Today* called it "The Bridge to Nowhere."
